Section A

Answer one question from this section.

Either,

1. (a) Examine Augustine's understanding of baptism. [15]
 (b) 'Baptism in itself has no saving power.'
 Evaluate this view. [15]

Or,

2. (a) Examine **two** different ways in which Christians understand the Eucharist. [15]
 (b) 'In the Eucharist, the bread and the wine are more than just symbols.'
 Evaluate this view. [15]

Section B

Answer one question from this section.

Either,

3. (a) Outline ways in which the resurrection of Jesus has been understood by Bultmann and Wright. [15]
 (b) 'Bultmann's interpretation of the resurrection is more convincing than Wright's interpretation.'
 Evaluate this view. [15]

Or,

4. (a) Examine issues concerning the use of male language about God. [15]
 (b) 'God is best described as mother rather than father.'
 Evaluate this view. [15]

Or,

5. (a) Explain why forgiveness **and** love of neighbour are important to Christians. [15]
 (b) 'Love of neighbour is the most important moral principle for Christians.'
 Evaluate this view. [15]
